2022 MEDICARE UPDATE

The Part A (Hospital Insurance) Deductible will be \$1556, per benefit period, for days 1-60 of inpatient hospitalization.

The Part B (Medical Insurance) Premium will be \$170.10 per month. Premiums will be higher for individuals with annual incomes of \$91,000 or more and married couples with annual incomes of \$182,000 or more. The

deductible will be \$233 per year of Medicare-approved charges.

LIVING WILLS & HEALTH CARE POWER OF ATTORNEY



A **living will** is a legal document that allows you to control the decision about whether your life should be prolonged by certain medical procedures. A **health care power of attorney** is a legal document in which

you give someone the power to make medical decisions for you if you are not competent or if you are not able to communicate.


